As an attorney and art historian, Amy Herman has been conducting The Art of Perception for law enforcement agencies at the local, state, and federal levels since 2004. The program began with the New York City Police Department (Crime Scene Investigation, Hostage Negotiation, Intelligence, Domestic Violence, Homicide Detectives, Threat Assessment) and over the last decade has expanded to many different agencies involved in investigative, prosecutorial, analytical, and intelligence work, all of which seek to improve the observation and communication skills of their personnel. Participants include the FBI (Surveillance, CIRG, Behavioral Analysis), the CIA, the Department of Justice, the New York Country District Attorney, the Philadelphia Police Department (Detective Bureau), and the Chicago Police Department (Detective Bureau) as well as the French National Police and Interpol. Her book, Visual Intelligence, was published in 2016 and has been used in law enforcement agencies' training curricula nationwide.
